Cost

The Aerial Lineman Program is free to eligible participants. The cost of the training is underwritten by a grant from the Office of Skills Development. Tools and equipment are provided for students use during the course, plus graduates retain over \$3,000 in personal protective equipment and climbing gear to begin their career. Certifications embedded in the course are also offered at no cost to students.

Students are responsible for:

- Pen and paper
- Lineman climbing boots
- [Recommended] Three (3) long sleeved shirts that provide the flexibility and range of motion needed to move and climb. One (1) long sleeved shirt will be issued during the course of training for use as required during all field exercises.

Drug testing is a precondition for students to participate in field exercises. The drug screen is administered at no cost to students that receive a negative result and complete the

What to Look for in a Climbing Boot

Required for Training:

- Minimum of 6" height
- · Shank in the mid-sole
- Steel or composite toe
- Heal with a square front
- · Firm sole, no soft rubber

Recommended, Not Required for Training:

- Leather upper
- Waterproof
- Some future employers may require boots meeting ASTM F2892-11 EH standards

course. Students that receive a positive drug screen result, are administratively withdrawn from the course, or drop/withdraw from the course will be billed for the cost of the drug screen.

Upon application to the program, an advisor will provide additional instructions on where and how the drug screen will be administered at no cost to the applicant.

Entrance Requirements

Cossatot Community College of the University of Arkansas seeks to meet the needs of the public by providing open enrollment. To be admitted, applicants must meet the following requirements and submit a completed Aerial Lineman Application for Admission along with the required attachments via fax, mail or in-person.

- (1) At least 18 years of age
- (2) An Arkansas resident OR currently employed in Arkansas OR intend to work in Arkansas following graduation*
- (3) Have a valid driver's license
- (4) Able to pass a drug screen
- (5) Able to lift/carry up to 75 lbs. without assistance, climb telephone poles up to 40 feet, and work aloft in a bucket truck
- (6) Willing to actively seek employment in the broadband industry
- (7) Willing to provide employment information for a minimum of 18 months following the conclusion of training

Application for Admission

Applying is easy. No transcripts or tests are required for admission into the program. Simply complete an Aerial Lineman Application for Admission and submit it to Continuing Education Services along with the required attachments via fax, mail or in-person. Continuing Education advisors are available to assist applicants throughout the admission process.

^{*} Note: Employment/Letter of Intent to Work in Arkansas forms are made available by Continuing Education Services upon request.

Enrollment

Once the Application for Admission and supporting documents are received, they are processed on a first come, first-serve basis. Once approved for admission into the program, applicants have their first choice of available training dates. Efforts are made to ensure the greatest opportunity for participation in courses; however, registration beyond the published regular registration period cannot be guaranteed.

Dropping a Course

Students may drop a course up through the close of the published regular registration period for a course by contacting Continuing Education Services to complete the drop process. Students that drop a course will be removed from the course roster.

Withdrawing from a Course

Students must contact Continuing Education Services to withdraw from a course. Students withdrawing prior to the course end date will receive a "W" on their transcript. Failure to withdraw will result in an "F" being posted to the student's transcript.

Administrative Withdraw from a Course

Students may be administratively withdrawn from a course when:

- not present for the start of training (i.e. a "no show")
- · drug screen results are positive
- pre-test, introduction, and fall hazard portions of OSHA 10 safety training --- vital to student's readiness to participate in field exercises --- are not successfully completed before field exercises begin
- absent for more than 10 hours during the first 40 hours of training
- absent for more than 10 hours during the final 105 hours of training

Students administratively withdrawn from the program as a "no show" become ineligible to participate in the program for a period of 12 months.

Attendance Requirements

The Aerial Lineman Program is a fast-paced intensive program with stringent attendance requirements. Students are expected to arrive promptly and be present for all class sessions and field exercises. Any class session or activity missed whole or in part, regardless of cause, reduces the opportunity for learning and may adversely affect a student's ability to meet the learning outcomes required to receive a Certificate of Completion. Persons with life or health conditions that may hinder attendance may wish to delay application for admission until a strong commitment to attendance can be made.

If an emergency arises, students must contact their instructor as early as possible prior to the start of class to best ensure arrangements can be made to make-up missed instruction time. Make-up sessions are subject to the availability of an instructor and are not guaranteed; therefore, students who are late or miss class for any reason are not guaranteed they will be able to make up missed instruction time or successfully complete the course. Absences exceeding: 1) 10 hours within the first 40 hours of training of or 2) 10 hours withing the final 105 hours of training may be subject to expulsion from the program due to lack of attendance.

If provision for supplemental training is requested and/or required in order to meet course requirements, the student shall be responsible for the costs incurred including payment of a classroom instructor hired by Continuing Education Services, their own transportation and other associated costs should they accept these arrangements.

Dress Code

A long sleeved shirt that provides the flexibility and range of motion needed to move and climb, jeans/pants, climbing boots, and personal protective equipment are required for field exercises. Personal protective equipment is provided to students for use during the course. Failure to observe the dress code and/or failure to comply with other program guidelines may result in termination from the program.

Requirements for Successful Completion

- (1) Attend required training sessions
- (2) Complete all required quizzes and assignments
- (3) Demonstrate safe practice
- (4) Comply with program guidelines
- (5) Earn an OSHA 10-Hour Construction Card
- (6) Earn a Heartsaver First Aid CPR AED Card
- (7) Earn a Heartsaver Bloodborne Pathogens Certificate
- (8) Earn an ATSSA National Flagger Certificate
- (9) Achieve a passing grade of 70% or greater on the classroom and field exercises

Student Conduct
